UGRA Honors Retiring Director

At the March 27, 2019 Upper Guadalupe River Authority (UGRA) Board meeting, the Board of Directors accepted the resignation of long-time UGRA Director Mike Allen. Mr. Allen served two terms on the UGRA Board with his initial appointment in October 2008. He was reappointed by Governor Perry to serve an additional six-year term in 2013. Mr. Allen served on several UGRA Board committees including the Executive Committee and served as President of the Board of Directors for two terms. His recent appointment by Governor Abbott to the Lower Colorado River Authority Board necessitates his resignation from UGRA after a long, successful tenure.



Mr. Allen currently owns and operates the Hill County RV Park in Kerrville. He was in the banking business for 45 years serving as President and CEO of five different banks including Pioneer Bank – Kerrville. During his career, Mr. Allen served on several other boards in four separate communities including the Headwaters Groundwater Conservation District in Kerr County.

“Mike Allen’s experience on the UGRA Board has been invaluable in helping us to set, implement, and achieve goals that are in line with our mission. Mike has been a mentor to me and other Board members as they come onboard. His banking background has been very beneficial in the monthly review of our financial statements and in the annual budget process. A true asset for UGRA.
