Only 10-20% of water used to irrigate our campus is from the City of Kerrville. On our designated watering days, we pull water into our tanks to use. Peterson only pulls 1 day per week from the City of Kerrville, not the allotted 2

-Facts About Our Tanks-

90,000 gallons of water are stored in the Peterson tanks.

How It Works:

- 1) Water runs off the air handling units at hospital.
- 2) That water is collected into an intermediate tank, used to catch water from air handling units.
- 3) Collected water is then pumped into the three large storage units seen on front page.
